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### **I. PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this policy is to ensure compliance with Campus Security Enhancement Act 110 ILCS 12/20.

### **II. SCOPE:**

This policy applies to all members of the Trinity International University (University) community.

### **III. POLICY:**

The University is committed to a nonviolent environment for all employees and students. Acts of violence and threats of violence are not acceptable conduct in the campus community and will not be tolerated. In service of this commitment to the welfare, health, and safety of all those in its campus community, the University has developed a comprehensive Campus Violence Prevention Plan (CVPP), which can be found on the University Safety and Security website.

The CVPP focuses on principles of early intervention and proactive engagement to prevent violence and provide supportive services. Based on the assessment that certain conduct may be a precursor to violent behavior as those recognized in the *Pathway to Violence*, the CVPP identifies thresholds of unacceptable conduct and standardized responses to those who cross those thresholds. Thresholds of unacceptable conduct include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Acts and threats of violence toward a specific person, unspecified person, and/or the campus as a whole.
- Significant violent ideations, the expression of violent ideas or the intent to harm others.
- Pattern of physical or emotional bullying and/or intimidation.
- Persistent, unwelcome pursuit of a personal and/or sexual relationship, and/or verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that is perceived as intimidating, aggressive, threatening, and/or an abuse of power.
- The expression of thoughts, ideas, and/or engaging in behaviors which indicate an obsessive, excessive, and/or inappropriate focus on violence.
